

March 11, 2021 Update from Mark Alliegro

Our constituents in the Plymouth area have requested that we provide them with occasional updates on what is going on in government. These updates could be circulated to the membership and/or used as content for the Committee's website. I explained that taking on another task might be difficult, especially during this time of Committee hearings, executive sessions, general assemblies, and reviewing countless bills. But we have to keep in mind that these Grafton County Republicans helped to get us elected, and they want to help us win the day in Concord and Haverhill. To make it as easy as possible, I suggested the following approach: Once every week or two, we will be prompted for highlights in our own spheres of influence. We can respond with just a few lines. For example, if I were to prepare an update of a recent week, it would look something like this:

The Executive Departments & Administration Committee voted along party lines (10-9) to recommend passing HB 544, which bans the teaching of Critical Race Theory and related racist concepts in our schools, state agencies, and for state contractors. The bill has drawn national attention and is now headed to the Senate for review and recommendation.
